Vijetha and Sanjana explored the evolution of botanical representations in relation to the depiction of specific plant species, different plant parts and the types of geometrical shapes used.

The motifs in this poster were originally illustrated by Hase artists Radhakrishna Bandagadde and Guruprasad Kanchi. While some motifs are a symbolic representation of identifiable plants, others bear similarities to the morphology of plant species.
